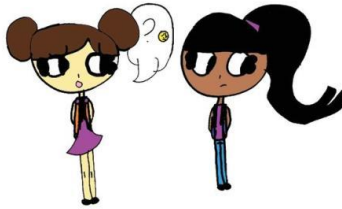
Kim Feeney

""I Have a Really Old Book. How Much Is It Worth?""

Inevitably, used bookstore employees will answer the phone to this question a few times a year, if not at least once a month: "I was cleaning out my [parents'/partner's/ grandparents'/aunt's] house, and I found this book. It's *really old*. Could I sell it to you? How much is it worth?"

When my maternal grandmother passed away, I inherited her illustrated copy of *Heidi*, which *her* grandmother had inscribed and given to her as a gift. As a child, I had read this book until the cover was in literal shreds. By the quality of the paper and the age at which my grandmother might have received it, I estimate it was published in the late 1930s or early 40s; certainly, during wartime, when resources were being conserved as much as possible. You can *feel* how different the paper was then. It's a true piece of history.

For years, the book had been sitting, held together by rubber bands, in a closet at my parents' house. Not a fitting place for something that was once so well-loved. I finally asked my mother to have it rebound for my birthday a few years ago,

and we went through the expensive process of sending it to a bindery for repair. It came back shiny and well-preserved, with a glossy new cover and

Book Reviews

Reviews by Claudia:

Ghosts, by Raina Telgemeier, is a Graphix Scholastic publication, set around Dias de Muertos. Catrina's family has moved to the coast of Northern California in hopes that the climate will help her younger sister, Maya, who has cystic fibrosis. Catrina has had to leave her friends behind, and her attitude is not helping make settling into the new town a happy occasion. Exploring the new area, a neighbor tells them that here are ghosts in the town. Maya is excited to meet one, but Catrina is frightened. As Dias de Muertos – the day when the ghosts of the dead reunite with their loved ones – approaches, Catrina “must figure out how to put aside her fears for her sister's sake and her own.” This is a “moving and insightful story about the power of family and friendship, and how it gives us the courage to do what we never thought possible.” This graphic novel is one of several written by Raina Telgemeier – Smile is about a sixth-grade girl with braces, and Guts is a short story of throwing up. Really. Recommended for ages 8-12.

The Gabriel Hounds, by Mary Stewart, features Christy Mansel, a young English woman traveling solo through the Middle East who unexpectedly runs into her cousin, Charles, in Damascus. The semi-romantic second cousins decide a spontaneous visit to Great-Aunt Harriet would be an excellent adventure. The family has historically forbidden unannounced visits with Aunt Harriet, but the cousins are enticed by their expectation of exploring Lady Harriet's palace, Dar Ibrahim in the High Lebanon. Rumor has it that when the palace's Gabriel hounds run howling, someone will die. Christy arrives before Charles and is soon immersed in an exotic mystery comprised of crumbling architectural wonders, a menagerie, a resident physician, and a very few Arab servants. She shortly discovers all is not as it seems, and that she is more a prisoner than a guest. As Christy, and soon Charles, attempt to escape the palace, secrets are discovered, and death visits those within its sinister walls. This is a fairly tame murder mystery, with an interesting setting and characters, loosely based on the life of real-life Lady Hester Stanhope. Mary Stewart is one of my sister's favorite authors, and while I prefer a little more action, I'm glad I read the book.

Edgar Rice Burroughs – The Mad King – 1926 – Adventure

Life as a gentleman-farmer in the once-wild West was hardly exciting enough for an adventurer and master swordsman like Barney Custer. So, when he had the chance to make the long voyage to the land of Lutha, he took it and there encountered more adventure in a few months than most people find in a lifetime. A crumbling kingdom, a black-hearted regent and his diabolical cohorts, a beautiful princess trapped in a dark and dismal dungeon, sinister plots and harrowing escapes – this is what Barney Custer found and this is what awaits the reader when he begins this tale of romantic adventure from the pen of master storyteller Edgar Rice Burroughs — compete with swordplay and intrigue, a beautiful princess in need of rescue, a courageous American hero, a throne in danger, evil conspirators, derring-do and narrow..

I must admit I've not previously read any of Burrough's stand-alone novels. This one is quite good. It checks all the boxes an adventure must to grab and hold my attention throughout. I give it a B+.

Lisa Scottoline – Courting Trouble – 2002 – Mystery

From New York Times bestselling author Lisa Scottoline, a novel featuring the all-female ass-kicking wise-cracking Philadelphia law firm Rosato and Associates How many people get to solve their own murder? A quiet Fourth of July weekend at the beach is shattered when Anne Murphy opens her morning newspaper. Staring back at her from the front page is her own photo, under the headline LAWYER MURDERED. Once the body in the morgue is identified, the murderer will realize their mistake. In the meantime, playing dead to stay alive, Anne must find out who is trying to kill her. Unable to rely on the police, who have already allowed her stalker to slip through their hands once, she has no choice but to confide in her new colleagues at Rosato & Associates. It will take all their combined ingenuity to crack the case before it's too late.

David Lake – The Ring of Truth – Fantasy – 1982

Our cosmos, throughout its enormous length of galaxies, and down to its smallest molecules, obeys the same laws of physics and chemistry from one end to the other. But it is now suspected that somewhere in the vast reaches of space, there may well be other universes with completely different natural laws.

But even on these worlds, foreign beyond imagining, there may yet be great adventurers – alien Magellans and Columbuses whose thirst for exploration cannot be assuaged. Intelligent beings who would risk anything to know what lies over the horizon, beyond the parameters of the known world.

Travel now with Prince Kernin of Palur, just such an explorer in just such an alien universe, and discover wonders beyond imagining, in a world very different from our own, as he ventures to the ends of his earth and to find the elusive Ring of Truth.

Strange and wonderful people and cultures abound on the Prince's world. Go with him to discover them and their unique ways. Another fun read. I give it a B. Lake didn't write a lot of books, but if you like this one, he does have more.

Alice Hoffman – Skylight Confessions – Literature – 2007

Arlyn Singer believes in destiny and love. On the night her father dies she's sure fate will send her true love to her. But destiny seems to be playing a trick when he sends her John Moody who is dreamy Arlyn's opposite. Their marriage leads them and their children to a glass house in Connecticut built by John's father, a place of skylights and fairytales, of ghosts and regret. Their son, Sam, is a brilliant, explosive artist. Daughter Blanca is a beautiful loner who tries to protect her brother from his demons and his destiny and who lives in a world of books. Will, Arlyn and John's grandson, is left to put together the mysterious pieces of their family, a puzzle of people who don't know the first thing about love. All families make their own rules, and the Moodys are no exception.

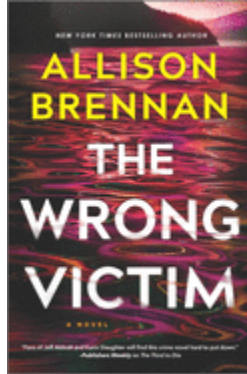

Allison Brennan - The Wrong Victim (Quinn & Costa Thriller #3) – Mystery – 26.99



A bomb explodes on a sunset charter cruise out of Friday Harbor at the height of tourist season and kills everyone on board. Now this fishing and boating community is in shock and asking who would commit such a heinous crime--the largest act of mass murder in the history of the San Juan Islands.

Forensic profilers know there are two types of domestic terrorists: those who use violence to instill fear for political purposes but stop at murder because it detracts from the cause, and those who crave attention and are willing to maim and murder for their own agenda.

Accused of putting profits before people after leaking fuel that caused a massive fish kill, the West End Charter company may itself have been the target. But as special agent Matt Costa, detective Kara Quinn and the rest of the FBI team begin their investigation, they discover that plenty of people might have wanted someone dead on that yacht. Now they must track down who is responsible and stop them before they strike again.

Robyn Carr - A Family Affair – Romance – 28.99



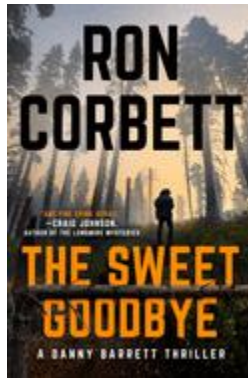
Life's biggest dilemmas can provide its sweetest rewards

Ron Corbett - The Sweet Goodbye (A Danny Barrett Novel) – Mystery – 27.00



In this thrilling new series from Edgar-nominated author Ron Corbett, the most dangerous predator in the Maine wilderness walks on two feet-and it is Danny Barrett's job to bring him down. Something is not right in the North Maine Woods. A small family-run lumber company should not have more than two hundred million unaccountable dollars on their books. Money like that comes from moving something other than wood across the border. The first agent the FBI sent undercover was their best man-sure to get the answers that were needed. He was dead within a month. Now, Danny Barrett is taking his place. Before he was a cop, Danny grew up in the woods of Northern Michigan. He is the only chance the feds have of getting answers, but how many more will have to die first?

Jennifer Egan – The Candy House – Literary Fiction – 28.00



Named a Most Anticipated Book of the Year by *Time*, *Entertainment Weekly*, *Vogue*, *Good Housekeeping*, *Oprah Daily*, *Glamour*, *USA Today*, *Parade*, *Bustle*, *San Francisco Chronicle*, *Seattle Times*, *The Boston Globe*, *Tampa Bay Times*, *BuzzFeed*, *Vulture* and many more!

From one of the most celebrated writers of our time, a literary figure with cult status, a "sibling novel" to her Pulitzer Prize- and NBCC Award-winning *A Visit from the Goon Squad*--an electrifying, deeply moving novel about the quest for authenticity and meaning in a world where memories and identities are no longer private.

The Candy House opens with the staggeringly brilliant Bix Bouton, whose company, Mandala, is so successful that he is "one of those tech demi-gods with whom we're all on a first name basis." Bix is 40, with four kids, restless, desperate

for a new idea, when he stumbles into a conversation group, mostly Columbia professors, one of whom is experimenting with downloading or "externalizing" memory. It's 2010. Within a decade, Bix's new technology, "Own Your Unconscious"--that allows you access to every memory you've ever had, and to share every memory in exchange for access to the memories of others--has seduced multitudes. But not everyone.

In spellbinding interlocking narratives, Egan spins out the consequences of Own Your Unconscious through the lives of multiple characters whose paths intersect over several decades. Intellectually dazzling, *The Candy House* is also extraordinarily moving, a testament to the tenacity and transcendence of human longing for real connection, love, family, privacy and redemption. In the world of Egan's spectacular imagination, there are "counters" who track and exploit desires and there are "eluders," those who understand the price of taking a bite of the Candy House. Egan introduces these characters in an astonishing array of narrative styles--from omniscient to first person plural to a duet of voices, an epistolary chapter and a chapter of tweets.

If *Goon Squad* was organized like a concept album, *The Candy House* incorporates Electronic Dance Music's more disjunctive approach. The parts are titled: Build, Break, Drop. With an emphasis on gaming, portals, and alternate worlds, its structure also suggests the experience of moving among dimensions in a role-playing game.

The Candy House is a bold, brilliant imagining of a world that is moments away. Egan takes to stunning new heights her "deeply intuitive forays into the darker aspects of our technology-driven, image-saturated culture" (*Vogue*). *The Candy House* delivers an absolutely extraordinary combination of fierce, exhilarating intelligence and heart.

Heather Graham – Crimson Summer – Romance – 27.99

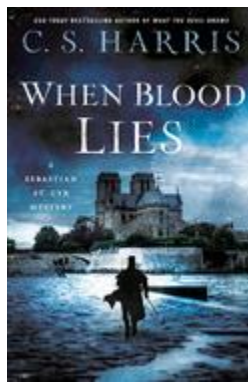


They're not going down without a fight.

When FDLE special agent Amy Larson discovers a small horse figurine amid the bloody aftermath of a gang massacre in the Everglades, she recognizes it immediately. The toy is the calling card of the apocalypse cult that Amy and her partner, FBI special agent Hunter Forrest, have been investigating, and it can only mean one thing: this wasn't an isolated skirmish--it was the beginning of a war.

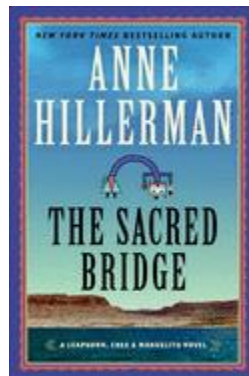
As tensions between rival gangs rise, so does the body count, and Amy and Hunter's investigation leads them to a violent, far-right extremist group who are in no hurry to quell the civil unrest. With a deadly puppet master working to silence their every lead, it's a race against the clock to figure out who's been pulling the strings and put a stop to the escalating cartel turf war before the Everglades run red.

C.S. Harris - When Blood Lies (Sebastian St. Cyr Mystery) – 26.00



Sebastian St. Cyr, Viscount Devlin, has spent years unraveling his tragic past, and now what has been done in the dark will come to light in this gripping new historical mystery from the USA Today bestselling author of *What the Devil Knows*. March, 1815. The Bourbon King Louis XVIII has been restored to the throne of France, Napoleon is in exile on the isle of Elba, and Sebastian St. Cyr, Viscount Devlin, has traveled to Paris in hopes of tracing his long-lost mother, Sophie, the errant Countess of Hendon. But his search ends in tragedy when he comes upon the dying Countess in the wasteland at the tip of the Île de la Cité. Stabbed—apparently with a stiletto—and thrown from the crenelated bastions of the island's ancient stone bridge, Sophie dies without naming her murderer. Sophie had been living in Paris under an assumed name as the scandalous mistress of Maréchal Alexandre McClellan, the scion of a noble Scottish Jacobite family that took refuge in France after the Forty-Five. Once one of Napoleon's most trusted and successful generals, McClellan has now sworn allegiance to King Louis XVIII and is serving in the delegation negotiating on behalf of France at the Congress of Vienna. It doesn't take Sebastian long to realize that the French authorities have no interest in involving themselves in the murder of a notorious Englishwoman at such a delicate time. And so, grieving and shattered by his mother's death, Sebastian takes it upon himself to hunt down her killer.

Anne Hillerman - The Sacred Bridge (Leaphorn, Chee & Manuelito Novel #7) – Mystery – 26.99



An ancient mystery resurfaces with ramifications for the present day in this gripping chapter in the Leaphorn, Chee & Manuelito series from *New York Times* bestselling author Anne Hillerman.

Sergeant Jim Chee's vacation to beautiful Antelope Canyon and Lake Powell has a deeper purpose. He's on a quest to unravel a sacred mystery his mentor, the Legendary Lieutenant Joe Leaphorn, stumbled across decades earlier.

Fern Michaels - Fear Thy Neighbor: A Riveting Novel of Suspense – 27.00



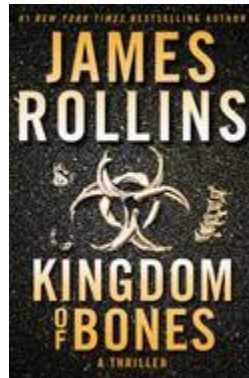

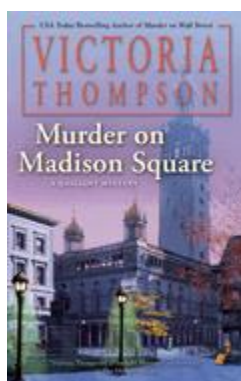
What has made the biosphere run amok? Is it a natural event? Or more terrifyingly, did someone engineer it?

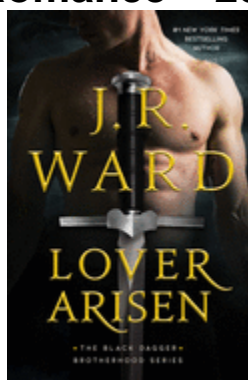
Mother Nature--red in tooth and claw--is turning against humankind, propelling the entire world into the Kingdom of Bones.

J.R Ward - Lover Arisen: Volume 20 (Black Dagger Brotherhood) – Romance – 28.00



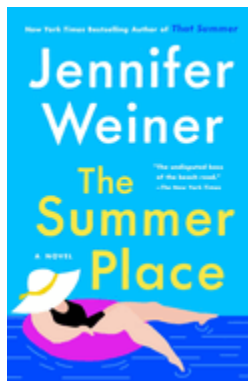
True love brings a deadly threat to the Black Dagger Brotherhood in this sizzling new novel in J.R. Ward's #1 *New York Times* bestselling series.

Kristin Hannah – Pack Up the Moon – Romance – 8.99



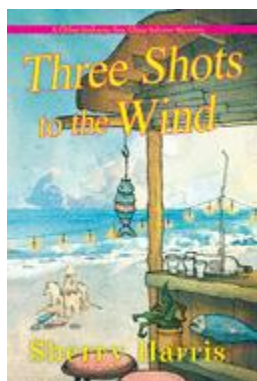

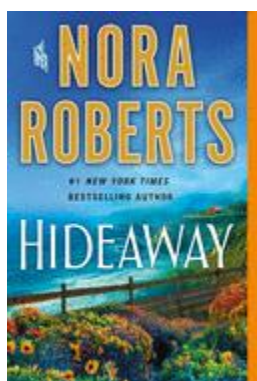
Kathy Reichs - Fatal Voyage (Temperance Brennan Novel #4) – Mystery – 9.99

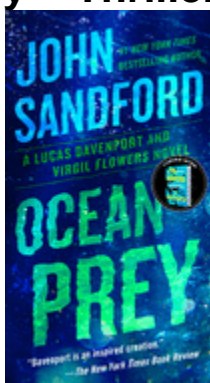

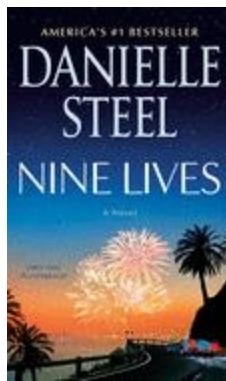
John Sandford – Ocean Prey – Thriller – 9.99

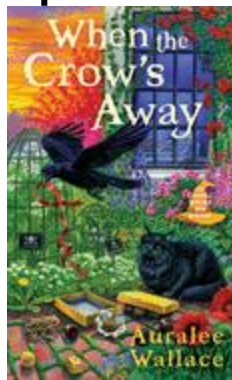

To me, the book is absolutely priceless. But in strict relation to commerce, I approximate its worth to be between 5 and 10 dollars. Because it has been rebound, I might be able to sell it for 15 to a customer who is feeling spendy.

The world of books is strange. Just as, in January, I told you that there is a whole cabal of people who love books more than anything else dumping them into the recycling bin and trash on

the regular, most of the people who sell them to you will tell you that 98% of books are worth next to nothing.

But what accounts for this? Well, as with every good answer, it's multi-faceted. Besides the obvious concept of supply and demand, here are just a few factors that contribute to a book's worth:

Age

Surprisingly, much of the time, age is not a consideration when valuing books. I once read a bookseller forum post that said, in America, only books published before the 1860s are considered antiquarian. Everything after that up until 30 years ago is just vintage, a vague and often meaningless term that encompasses items manufactured during a 132-year span. Everyone has a different definition of what defines the terms "antiquarian" and "vintage, but learning this is kind of like a microcosmic version of walking through the dinosaur exhibit at the Field Museum and realizing there were millions of years and five mass extinctions before modern history even started. So when people call and say, "I have a *really old book!*," I sometimes resist the urge to ask if they have truly found a Gutenberg bible in their grandmother's attic.

Our equation of age with value is certainly understandable, though. It wasn't long ago that books were considered inaccessible to most people: before the 1820s, to be exact, when the steam press allowed for mass production of books. 200 years is not such a long time. My great, great grandmothers must have been alive in the 1820s, and I was taught that books were a privilege in my childhood during the 1990s. They were never to be written in, tossed about, or thrown away. I guess it goes to show that personal worth often has nothing to do with monetary value.

Edition

If you were a serious Nancy Drew collector, and I told you I had two nice copies of *The Secret of the Old Clock*, which of these would you buy? One is the yellow, library bound Scholastic version from 1992 that most of us are familiar with. The other is the first issue from 1930. Some people just want a copy to match all their other copies, and that's totally fine. But a lot of people would choose the original. There's something about owning a book that represents the time it first touched its readers, made them journey into that world with the characters. And, of course, Nancy Drew has a long history of that. Not to mention that such things become scarcer as time progresses, and if a book lives to be reprinted multiple, multiple times, earlier editions will become more valuable.

Condition

Okay, of course, you want the first edition. I haven't told you that I have two copies, though: one is pristine with just a little bit of shelf wear. The other is missing its dust jacket and its spine is broken. Which one would you pay more for?

You get the point, and I won't belabor it. A book's value often depreciates in equal measure to its deterioration. A primer from 1843 might indeed be antiquarian, but if it's full of the pencil

holes and doodles of bored Victorian children, it's worth much less than a copy that a slacking student never bothered to open.

Okay, But Can I Still Sell You Books?

You've read the facts. But the truth is, you need to make some fast cash. You've put a lot of money into your books, and you need to offload and get *something* back to put towards groceries or rent. All these books are just sitting around, untouched. You don't want to recycle them or throw them away, and you need to feed your family. Maybe you're considering my anecdote about *Heidi* and thinking, "Yeah, but I could *use* that five or ten bucks. I have to eat. And you're a bookstore. So why can't you just buy my books and sell them at a higher price?"

Well...we're back to square one. Remember when I told you that 98% of books are worth nothing? It was not a lie. Most people, unless they are sellers of antiquarian and rare books who have apprenticed through a previous owner, do not make a substantial living off of bookselling. It's unfortunately something you have to do because you love it. I know that sounds mushy and unrealistic, but some people really do it for the love of bound paper and ink, and of classifying and organizing.

All of this boils down to the fact that, in order to make even a little bit of money from most books, we have to be cautious when purchasing. Which is why we offer store credit that covers up to half of your purchase: because we can give you more that way, and that helps us remain worthy to the local reading community. If you've ever been to a store that offers both payouts and store credit, you've realized that you get substantially less from a cash payout than you do from the store credit, sometimes by as much as 1/4. When we do buy books from people, it's generally at yard sale prices (\$0.25-\$1.00 a book). Used bookselling is an educated guessing game. You may purchase many books that are worth nothing, or will never sell, books that amount to a \$0.50 profit by the original owner and sit on a shelf for years. A book priced at \$300 that no one wants is a book that is worth nothing.

Why is Store Credit a Good Option for Most People?

There are still ways to cut down on costs using store credit. In our store, we give you (in most cases) 1/4 of the cover price of each book, which you can use as a 50% discount toward any used book in the store until you run out of credit. Our books are priced at half the retail price or lower, which means you are buying books for 1/4 of their cover price when you have store credit.

If you're a low-income person or part of a low-income family, but you still want you and your children to read, that means you're getting a book that would cost \$16 at Barnes and Noble for \$4. A lot of the time, these books are in the same condition as when they came from the distributor. And you get to keep them. Forever. Our prices are so low for our degree of organization and inventory that some customers literally think they are renting the books, and we have difficulty explaining that they do not have to return them. Now, that's a way around value, straight into personal worth.

And if you've stumbled across some books you need to jettison, but you're not personally a reader, store credit can still be beneficial. We get people opening accounts for children, grandchildren, and dear friends who are big readers. If you don't know anyone who could use the

credit and are feeling charitable, you can donate the credit to a fund for local teachers buying for their classrooms or for active-duty military personnel. A reader in your life will be able to greatly benefit from the discount.

I Don't Want to Sell to You. How Do I Make Money from Books?

I'm not saying that making some money from books is impossible. It just takes a disproportionate amount of work compared to the profit. Sure, you can throw something on Facebook Marketplace with one blurry picture and hope it sells. It might, and the buyer might be perfectly happy with it. But small online booksellers spend hours sourcing, cleaning, mending, photographing, describing, packing, and shipping books. They deal with final value fees, fraudulent and unreasonably unhappy buyers, and a whole manner of other deterrents to the practice of their trade. There is a learning curve, and to be taken seriously, it's a serious part-to-full-time job. You have to learn the policies and fine print of the platform through which you sell and pay for subscriptions above certain item amounts. You have to know what "first thus, foxing on the spine" means. The world of bookselling can be a gatekeeping world. In some respects, I am ashamed to say, it is designed to keep people out. So if you want to sell books and you have the time, passion, dedication, ingenuity, and downright stubbornness, I'll be the first to say: Do it! But you should consider which option explained above would be the most beneficial to *you*. You do not want to spend the valuable hours of your life doing something that will not give you the reward you deserve.
