

Steinway Artist BK Davis has been composing and performing music for 40 years. Born in Davenport, Iowa, home of 20th century jazz great Bix Beiderbecke, Davis was raised in a musical household. His father, Bishop Ezekiel Davis, conscripted him as a teen to serve as musical director for the seven churches he oversaw, while his mother, Rose Davis, an accomplished vocalist, attended to his vocal and instrumental training. The jazz pianist/singer plays more than a dozen instruments, including piano, guitar, organ and drums in idioms spanning Jazz, R&B, gospel, soul, and pop. He has written theme music and jingles for the Boy Scouts of America and an Indianapolis 500 race, and has directed choirs throughout the Midwest and West Coast. Davis has played or toured with artists including B.B. King, Billy Preston, Gerald Albright, Michael "Patches" Stewart and the late soul legend, Johnnie Taylor. He co-wrote original music with rock and roll legend Little Richard, as well as McFadden and Whitehead.


variety of establishments and ties into the community. The charismatic Main wants Myah to retire her six-inch stilettos and let him take care of her- offering Myah everything under the sun.

### What's Left



Synopsis: What's Left is a living record of **Tate Lewis-Carroll**'s dying father and the often estranged but sometimes idyllic relationship they shared. As urgently as the initial cancer diagnosis and death six months afterwards, this project began with startlingly raw poems written beside the father's deathbed. Yet, upon uncovering the father's wide-ranging nature photography, Lewis-Carroll is able to reexamine and finally relate to him in a way that had seemed unreachable in life. Obsessed by this act of excavation, Lewis-Carroll unpacks every eclectic box in an attempt to discover what's missing, what's sincere, and what's left after death.

"In What's Left Tate Lewis-Carroll attempts to grieve the death of their father, a father who, while sometimes loving, was often distant, already gone. By turns brutal and delicate, shocking and deft, Lewis-Carroll's poems are operations, autopsies and exorcisms, that attempt to register the transformation of a shadowy, scintillating absent presence into one that, now, suddenly, will also always be so. This is critical and intensive work, and a bold and energetic debut.

## **Book Reviews**


Reviews by Claudia:

The Indigo Girl by Natasha Boyd is an historical fictional account of



Eliza Lucas, a real-life South Carolina entrepreneur. In 1739, 16-year-old Eliza is left in charge of 3 plantations and the resident slaves, a frail mother, and a younger sister when her father leaves to pursue his military ambitions. When she realizes he is mortgaging the family's properties to achieve his career goals, Eliza believes she can save them from financial disaster by manufacturing indigo dye cakes – a process she observed when living in Antigua. Drawing from historical research and actual letters written by Eliza, Boyd fashions a story of a teenage girl, who against substantial odds, produces indigo dye, one of the largest exports of South Carolina. As noted in online reviews, "Although largely overlooked by historians, the accomplishments of Eliza Lucas influenced the course of US history. When she passed away in 1793, President George Washington served as a pallbearer at her funeral." Initially, I thought this was going to be a fluff piece, but the story - especially a story based in historical fact – was an enjoyable and informative read. Recommended.

The Botany of Desire: : A Plant's-Eye View of the World by Michael Pollan




is a non-fiction book that links 4 human desires with plants: Sweetness = Apple, Beauty = Tulip, Intoxication = Marijuana, and Control = Potato. Published in 2002 some of the information is a bit outdated, but still informative. The idea for Pollan's musings as he worked in his garden and observed the bees in nearby apple blossoms, resulted in him questioning how different humans were from the bees in aiding the distribution, growth, and diversity of plants. Could it be that plants control their own destiny - and humans? This book offers historical information and insight that may be new to you... the origin and spread of the apple – including facts about the real John Chapman (Johnny Appleseed); the tulip, its origin, reach and amazing use – and crash - as currency in Holland; cannabis and the way laws aided its growth as an industry; and the potato from South American origins to Europe to genetically modified potatoes. The book is slow reading in places and at times difficult to follow Pollan's train of thought, but I found it overall intriguing and worthwhile. If you'd like to learn more about human interaction with familiar plants, I recommend the book.

Raven Black (The first book in the "Shetland" series) by Ann Cleeves – Mystery (2006) Winner of the coveted 2006 Duncan Lawrie Dagger Award



Long a celebrated crime writer in Britain, Ann Cleeves' fame went international when she won the coveted Duncan Lawrie Dagger for this amazing suspense novel, Raven Black. Like Colin Dexter's Inspector Morse or Peter Robinson's Inspector Banks, Cleeves' new detective, Inspector Jimmy Perez, is a very private and perceptive man whose bailiwick is a remote hamlet in the Shetland Islands. It is a cold January morning, and Shetland lies beneath a deep layer of snow. Trudging home, Fran Hunter's eye is drawn to a splash of color on the frozen ground, ravens circling above. It is the strangled body of her teenage neighbor, Catherine Ross. The locals on the quiet island stubbornly focus their gaze on one man - loner and simpleton Magnus Tait. But when detective Jimmy Perez and his colleagues from the mainland insist on opening out the investigation, a veil of suspicion and fear is thrown over the entire community. For the first time in years, Catherine's neighbors nervously lock their doors while a killer lives on in their midst.

A fine British mystery that you'll enjoy.

Blood Flag (A Paul Madriani Novel) by Steve Martini (2016) - Legal Thriller



Defending a client accused of killing her father, attorney Paul Madriani is drawn into a treacherous conspiracy dating to World War II in this enthralling installment in the *New York Times* bestselling series.

Paul Madriani and Harry Hinds have a new client: Emma Brauer, a woman accused in the "mercy killing" of her aged father, Robert Brauer. Insisting she's innocent, Emma tells Paul about a package sent to her father shortly before he entered the hospital. Bequeathed to him by a member of his unit from World War II, the box contains a key and a slip of paper. Emma fears that this package is connected to her father's death. When Paul's young assistant Sofia is murdered, Madriani is blindsided by the realization that Emma's fears are well-grounded.

Digging into Robert's military history, Madriani discovers that other members of the Army unit Robert served with have recently died--under similarly suspicious circumstances. When he finds that the box sent to Brauer relates to a mysterious talisman that went missing at the end of the war--a feared Nazi relic known as the "Blood Flag"--Madriani and Hinds realize they are in for the fight of their lives.

With Emma's life on the line and their own safety in jeopardy, Madriani must uncover the truth before the evil of the Blood Flag is allowed to spin a new web.

Another entertaining thriller by Madriani. That said, I have enjoyed the courtroom drama in Martini's earlier Marriani books and there's precious little in this one. It's really an international thriller with a little legal stuff woven in. I give it a B.

The Vanishing Museum on the Rue Mistral (A Procencal Mystery) by M.L. Longworth (2021)



A breezy, charming, and perfectly escapist mystery set in the heart of sun- and wine-soaked Aix-en-Provence--where murder investigations are always put on hold for lunch and the only thing more sweeping than the story is the Mediterranean coastline.

Something strange has happened at the unassuming Musée de Quentin-Savary in Aix-en-Provence. When the director, Monsieur Achille Formentin, walks in one beautiful April morning, he is shocked to find the whole museum emptied of its contents--only a bench, the reception desk, and a lowly fern remain. Distressed, he calls the local police, and Aix's examining magistrate Antoine Verlaque sets out to discover the thief's identity. But it's the most baffling case Verlaque has ever encountered. Why would someone want to steal porcelain dessert plates, some old documents, and a few small paintings? Could this have something to do with the mysterious robbery of Madame de Montbarbon's apartment a few weeks earlier? And how can Verlaque possibly concentrate on the theft when he and his wife, Marine Bonnet, are going to have a baby?




V.C. Andrews - Little Paula (Eden #2) - Thriller - 28.00

Steve Berry - The Last Kingdom - Thriller - 29.00




King Ludwig II of Bavaria was an enigmatic figure who was deposed in 1886, mysteriously drowning three days later. Eccentric to the point of madness, history tells us that in the years before he died Ludwig engaged in a worldwide search for a new kingdom, one separate, apart, and in lieu of Bavaria. A place he could retreat into and rule as he wished. But a question remains: did he succeed?

Enter Cotton Malone. After many months, Malone's protégé, Luke Daniels, has managed to infiltrate a renegade group intent on winning Bavarian independence from Germany. Daniels has also managed to gain the trust of the prince of Bavaria, a frustrated second son intent on eliminating his brother, the duke, and restoring the Wittelsbach monarchy, only now with him as king. Everything hinges on a 19th century deed which proves that Ludwig's long-rumored search bore fruit--legal title to lands that Germany, China, and the United States all now want, only for vastly different reasons.

C.J. Box - Storm Watch (Joe Pickett Novel) - Mystery - 29.00



When a prominent University of Wyoming professor goes missing, authorities are stumped. That is, until Joe Pickett makes two surprising discoveries while hunting down a wounded elk on his district as an epic spring storm descends upon him. First, he finds the professor's vehicle parked on a remote mountainside. Then Joe finds the professor's frozen and mutilated body.

When he attempts to learn more, his investigation is obstructed **by** federal agents, extremists, and Governor Colter Allen. Nate Romanowski is rebuilding his falconry company--and financing this through crypto mining with the assistance of Geronimo Jones. He's then approached by a shadowy group of local militant activists that is gaining in power and influence, and demanding that Wyoming join other western states and secede from the union--by force, if necessary. They ask Nate to throw in with them, but he's wary. Should he trust them, or is he being set up?

As a storm of peril gathers around them, Joe and Nate confront it in different ways--and maybe, for the first time, on opposite sides.

### \*\*Janet Evanovich - The Recovery Agent (A Gabriela Rose Novel #1) - Mystery - 17.99



Lost something? Gabriela Rose knows how to get it back. As a recovery agent, she's hired to seek lost treasures, stolen heir-looms, or missing assets of any kind. She's reliable, cool under pressure, and well trained in weapons of all types. But Gabriela's latest job isn't for some bamboozled billionaire, it's for her own family, whose home is going to be wiped off the map if they can't come up with a lot of money fast.

Inspired by an old family legend, Gabriela sets off for the jungles of Peru in pursuit of the Ring of Solomon and the lost treasure of Lima. But this particular job comes with a huge problem attached to it--Gabriela's ex-husband, Rafer. It's Rafer who has the map that possibly points the way to the treasure, and he's not about to let Gabriela find it without him.

Rafer is as relaxed as Gabriela is driven, and he has a lifetime's experience getting under his ex-wife's skin. But when they aren't bickering about old times the two make a formidable team, and it's going to take a team to defeat the vicious drug lord who has also been searching for the fabled ring. A drug lord who doesn't mind leaving a large body count behind him to get it.

Gregg Hurwitz - The Last Orphan: An Orphan X Novel (Orphan X #8) Crime Thriller - 28.99




# Iris Johansen & Roy Johansen - More Than Meets the Eye (Kendra Michaels) – 29.00

In a blink, a terrific explosion rocks the woods, killing Barrett and most of the officers instantly.

Walter Mosley - Every Man a King: A King Oliver Novel – Mystery – 28.00




In this highly anticipated sequel to the Edgar award winner *Down the River Unto the Sea*, Joe King Oliver is entangled in a dangerous case when he's asked to investigate whether a white nationalist is being unjustly set up.

When friend of the family and multi-billionaire Roger Ferris comes to Joe with an assignment, he's got no choice but to accept, even if the case is a tough one to stomach. White nationalist Alfred Xavier Quiller has been accused of murder and the sale of sensitive information to the Russians. Ferris has reason to believe Quiller's been set up and he needs King to see if the charges hold.

This linear assignment becomes a winding quest to uncover the extent of Quiller's dealings, to understand Ferris' skin in the game, and to get to the bottom of who is working for whom. Even with the help of bodyguard and mercenary Oliya Ruez--no regular girl Friday--the machine King's up against proves relentless and unsparing.
