

Book Reviews

Reviews by Claudia:

The Moon is a Harsh Mistress (1966) by Robert Heinlein is a science fiction classic.



With recent news of a Google employee put on leave because of his claims of computer sentience, this 1996 novel is as relevant now as it was when first published. *The Moon is a Harsh Mistress*, was serialized in the magazine Worlds of If in 1965 and published as a complete work in 1966. In 1967, it won the Hugo Award and was nominated for the Nebula Award in 1966. A Prometheus Award

Hall of Fame novel, it is one of the top ten novels published before 1990, according to the Locus Poll Awards. When Technician Mannie Garcia O'Kelly-Davis arrives to fix the supercomputer that oversees the lunar penal colony (Loonies – the prisoners and outcasts sent to colonize the moon and their descendants) he discovers the computer has become self-aware. Initially, Mannie and Mike (Mannie's nickname for the computer) explore humor, but as the discontent of the Loonies builds, the story becomes (as Goodreads states) "one of revolution, of the rebellion of a former penal colony on the Moon against its masters on the Earth. It is a tale of a culture whose family structures are based on the presence of two men for every woman, leading to novel forms of marriage and family. It is the story of the disparate people, a computer technician, a vigorous young female agitator, and an elderly academic who become the movement's leaders, and of Mike, the supercomputer whose sentience is known only to the revolt's inner circle, who for reasons of his own is committed to the revolution's ultimate success." Really interesting read. Highly recommended.

Borkmann's Point: An Inspector Van Veeteren Mystery by Häkan Nesser is translated from the original Swedish.



In this American debut novel, protagonist Chief Inspector Van Veeteren assists the local police in a small town with the investigation of two recent ax murders. When another body is discovered and a colleague, a young female detective, disappears without a trace, Van Veeteren is under increased pressure to quickly find the killer, prevent another murder, and hopefully locate his colleague – unharmed. Interesting character studies and plot points. If you enjoy Scandinavian authors and mysteries, this may be for you. Recommended.

The Sailors' Rendezvous, An Inspector Maigret Mystery by Georges Simenon(1978)



It was indeed a photo, a picture of a woman. But the face was completely hidden, scribbled all over in red ink. Someone had tried to obliterate the head, someone very angry. The pen had bitten into the paper. There were so many criss-crossed lines that not a single square millimetre had been left visible. On the other hand, below the head, the torso had not been touched. A pair of large breasts. A light-coloured silk dress, very tight and very low cut.

Sailors don't talk much to other men, especially not to policemen. But after Captain Fallut's body is found floating near his trawler, they all mention the Evil Eye when they speak of the Ocean's voyage. The victim is Captain Fallut. The suspect is Pierre LeClinche, the boat's young radio operator, engaged to a girl who passionately believes he is innocent.

Georges Simenon was born in Liège, Belgium. At sixteen he began work as a journalist on the Gazette de Liège. He moved to Paris in 1922 and became a prolific writer of popular fiction, working under a number of pseudonyms. In 1931 he published the first of the novels featuring Maigret, his most famous and enduring creation. He wrote 75 Maigret mysteries.

An entertaining mystery set in France. While only 127 pages, it packs in much excitement. You don't get nearly as much back story and character development as in more recent books, and not nearly as much violence. You are presented a complex puzzle and you follow the inspector as he solves it. A well-done book. If you like Raymond Chandler, Agatha Christie, Rex Stout or Ross MacDonald, you'll like Simenon. I give it a B+.

Real Tigers (Slough House #3) by Mick Heron – Mystery (2016)



Catherine Standish knows that chance encounters never happen to spooks. She's worked in the Intelligence Service long enough to understand treachery, double-dealing and stabbing in the back.


What she doesn't know is why anyone would target her: a recovering drunk pushing paper with the other lost causes in Jackson Lamb's kingdom of exiles at Slough House.

Whoever it is holding her hostage, it can't be personal. It must be about Slough House. Most likely, it is about Jackson Lamb.

And say what you like about Lamb, he'll never leave a joe in the lurch. He might even be someone you could trust with your life . . .

Have you seen the Slough House series on Apple + TV? This is one of the series of books upon which the TV Series is based. I think they did a very good job adapting the books to the TV version and the books are very good. The mystery is intriguing and the banter between the book's characters makes the books quite entertaining and unique. I give the book a B+. Pick up one of Heron's books and you'll likely be hooked.

Shadows Reel by C.J. Box – Mystery (2022)



Wyoming Game Warden Joe Pickett and his wife, Marybeth, make separate discoveries that put the Pickett family in a pair of killers' crosshairs in this thrilling new novel in the bestselling series.

A day before the three Pickett girls come home for Thanksgiving, Joe is called out for a moose-poaching incident that turns out to be something much more sinister: a local fishing guide has been brutally tortured and murdered. At the same time, Marybeth opens an unmarked package at the library where she works and finds a photo album that belonged to an infamous Nazi official. Who left it there? And why?

She learns that during World War II, several Wyoming soldiers were in the group that fought to Hitler's Eagles Nest retreat in the Alps—and one of them took the Fuhrer's personal photo album. Did another take this one and keep it all these years? When a close neighbor is murdered, Joe and Marybeth face new questions: Who is after the book? And how will they solve its mystery before someone hurts them...or their girls?

Meanwhile, Nate Romanowski is on the hunt for the man who stole his falcons and attacked his wife. Using a network of fellow falconers, Nate tracks the man from one city to another. Even as he grasps the true threat his quarry presents, Nate swoops in for the kill—and a stunning final showdown.

C.J. Box is simply one of the mystery writers currently at the very top of the genre. If you like Tony Hillerman, Nevada Barr or Craig Johnson, you'll love C.J. Box! I give this book an A.



Kwame Alexander – An American Story – Juvenile Fiction – 18.99



Allison Brennan - Don't Open the Door (Regan Merritt #2) – Thriller – 28.99




A family torn apart. A botched investigation. She'll stop at nothing to get answers.



Colleen Coble – Dark of Night – Mystery – 18.99




The law is about justice--not grace. But perhaps ranger Annie Pederson can find a way to have both.

James Grippando – Code 6 – Crime Thriller – 27.99



Her father is Christian Gamble, CEO of Buck Technologies, a private data integration company whose clients include the CIA and virtually every counter-terrorism organization in the Western World. Kate's father adores her, and a play about the dark side of Big Data would be the ultimate betrayal in his eyes. But Kate is compelled to tell this story--not only as an artist exploring the personal information catastrophe that affects us all, but as a daughter trying to understand her mother's apparent loss of purpose, made even more disturbing by the suicide note she left behind: *I did it for Kate.*

Then Patrick Battle comes back into her life, changing everything she has ever thought about her play, her father, and her mother's tragic death. Patrick is a childhood friend, but he is now Buck's golden boy with security clearance to the company's most sensitive projects. 
Colleen Hoover - Heart Bones – Romance – 17.99



Deepti Kapoor – Age of Vice – Crime Fiction – 30.00



This is the age of vice, where money, pleasure, and power are everything, and the family ties that bind can also kill.

New Delhi, 3 a.m. A speeding Mercedes jumps the curb and in the blink of an eye, five people are dead. It's a rich man's car, but when the dust settles there is no rich man at all, just a shell-shocked servant who cannot explain the strange series of events that led to this crime. Nor can he foresee the dark drama that is about to unfold.

Deftly shifting through time and perspective in contemporary India, *Age of Vice* is an epic, action-packed story propelled by the seductive wealth, startling corruption, and bloodthirsty violence of the Wadia family -- loved by some, loathed by others, feared by all.

In the shadow of lavish estates, extravagant parties, predatory business deals and calculated political influence, three lives become dangerously intertwined: Ajay is the watchful servant, born into poverty, who rises through the family's ranks. Sunny is the playboy heir who dreams of outshining his father, whatever the cost. And Neda is the curious journalist caught between morality and desire. Against a sweeping plot fueled by loss, pleasure, greed, yearning, violence and revenge, will these characters' connections become a path to escape, or a trigger of further destruction?

Equal parts crime thriller and family saga, transporting readers from the dusty villages of Uttar Pradesh to the urban energy of New Delhi, *Age of Vice* is an intoxicating novel of gangsters and lovers, false friendships, forbidden romance, and the consequences of corruption. It is binge-worthy entertainment at its literary best.

Peter May – A Winter Grave – Mystery – 28.00



It is the year 2051. Warnings of climate catastrophe have been ignored, and vast areas of the planet are under water, or uninhabitably hot. A quarter of the world's population has been displaced by hunger and flooding, and immigration wars are breaking out around the globe as refugees pour into neighboring countries.

By contrast, melting ice sheets have brought the Gulf Stream to a halt and northern latitudes, including Scotland, are being hit by snow and ice storms. It is against this backdrop that Addie, a young meteorologist checking a mountain top weather station, discovers the body of a man entombed in ice.


The dead man is investigative reporter, George Younger, missing for three months after vanishing during what he claimed was a hill-walking holiday. But Younger was no hill walker, and his discovery on a mountain-top near the Highland village of Kinlochleven, is inexplicable.

Cameron Brodie, a veteran Glasgow detective, volunteers to be flown north to investigate Younger's death, but he has more than a murder enquiry on his agenda. He has just been given a devastating medical prognosis by his doctor and knows the time has come to face his estranged daughter who has made her home in the remote Highland village.

Arriving during an ice storm, Brodie and pathologist Dr. Sita Roy, find themselves the sole guests at the inappropriately named International Hotel, where Younger's body has been kept refrigerated in a cake cabinet. But evidence uncovered during his autopsy places the lives of both Brodie and Roy in extreme jeopardy.

As another storm closes off communications and the possibility of escape, Brodie must face up not only to the ghosts of his past, but to a killer determined to bury forever the chilling secret that George Younger's investigations had threatened to expose.


Joshua Hood - Robert Ludlum's the Treadstone Transgression (A Treadstone Novel) – Thriller – 9.99
