
Jubilee, by Margaret Walker, is a 1966 novel



based on Walker's maternal great-grandmother's story, told to her by her grandmother. The story begins in the antebellum years when Sis' Hetta, perhaps 29 years of age, dies in childbirth – the sixteenth child she has delivered, all single births. The girl child, Vyry, is the light skinned bastard child of the plantation master John Morris Dutton. Near the time of Vyry's birth, another daughter is born to Dutton and his wife, Big Missy. Little Miss Lillian and Vyry would play together until Big Missy could no longer stand hearing how much the two girls resembled one another, and Vyry was banished from the Big House. As the story moves through the Civil War years and to promises of Reconstruction, the deaths and illness of the plantation owners, Vyry's relationships, and choices she must make to protect those she loves to make a better life for them all, open one's eyes to an abhorrent part of America's history. Back Cover: "Weaving her own family's oral history with thirty years of research, Margaret Walker's novel brings the everyday experiences of slaves to light. *Jubilee* churns with the hunger, the hymns, the struggles, and the very breath of American history." Highly Recommended.

Voyagers by Ben Bova (1981) Sci Fi



Stoner knew. The fiery object hurtling toward the Earth was an alien spacecraft. But the world might never know. He was trapped in an iron cordon of secrecy, for the discovery had shattered the world power balance, setting off a brutal struggle for supremacy that raged from the sacred halls of the Vatican to the corridors of the Kremlin and the Pentagon. The forces of fear and treachery would use any weapon at their command, from mind war to sabotage, to keep the world in darkness.

Aided by a brilliant Soviet linguist and a lovely young student, Stoner planned a desperate mission, a wild, heart-stopping gamble to preserve the legacy of the star voyager for all mankind.

This is the first of the Voyager Trilogy by Bova. It's a classic Sci Fi trilogy I'd put on par with The Foundation and Dune trilogies. I give the individual books and the trilogy A-ratings and highly recommend them. You don't have to be Sci Fi fans to enjoy any of these three. They are great adventure literature.

The Fifth Victim: The Cherokee Pointe Series, Book 1 by Beverly Barton (2018) – Romantic Suspense



Some things shouldn't be seen....

Cherokee Pointe, Tennessee. Deep in the Smoky Mountains, the victim lies, sacrificed on a makeshift altar - the gruesome work of a killer who has evaded the authorities in state after state. FBI agent Dallas Sloan knows the scene all too well - just as he knows the killings won't stop until there are four more bodies.

Some warnings won't be heeded....

Genny Madoc's "sixth sense" has brought many of Cherokee Pointe's residents to her isolated log cabin, looking for help. But now it's Genny who needs help from the disturbing visions she sees - images that are getting stronger and more violent day by day.


Some fears can't be stopped....

Thrown together by necessity, drawn to each other by desire, Dallas and Genny must band together, searching the darkest heart of a town's hidden secrets before a twisted killer can complete a sinister plan that will make one

of them the fifth victim.

A bit too much character development at the beginning. It became tedious. I give it a B-. The law enforcement people were lost much of the time and the women we're mostly weak.

The Zero Hour by Joseph Finder (2011) – Thriller




FBI Special Agent and counterterrorism expert Sarah Cahill doesn't know the man she's tracking. But the so-called "Prince of Darkness" knows her intimately. So, when Sarah is summoned to Wall Street to investigate, little does she know that "she's" the one under surveillance... until the terrorist infiltrates himself into the deepest, most desperate corners of her life.

Soon Sarah is plunged into a deep labyrinth of intrigue and catastrophe as she races to uncover a diabolically clever conspiracy...before time runs out...and the clock strikes "THE ZERO HOUR."

A very engaging read that I give a B+. Sarah Cahill is a likable, sharp CIA agent facing up to the world's worst terrorist. The contest between the two is an international chess game of moves and countermoves leading up to an exciting climax. Plenty of action for thriller lovers. If you like David Baldacci, Andrew Gross, John Lescroart or Michael Connelly, you will like Joseph Finder.

Dead Eye, Grey Man #4 by Mark Greaney (2018) – Thriller




Ex-CIA master assassin Court Gentry gets hit with a blast from the past in the fourth Gray Man novel from #1 *New York Times* bestselling author Mark Greaney.

Court Gentry has always prided himself on his ability to disappear at will, to fly below the radar and exist in the shadows--to survive as the near-mythical Gray Man. But when he takes revenge upon a former employer who betrayed him, he exposes himself to something he's never had to face before: a killer who is just like him.

Code-named Dead Eye, Russell Whitlock is a graduate of the same ultra-secret Autonomous Asset Program that trained and once controlled Gentry. But now, Whitlock is a free agent who has been directed to terminate his fellow student of death. He knows how his target thinks, how he moves, and how he kills. And he knows the best way to do the job is to make Gentry run for his life--right up until the moment Dead Eye finally ends it...

Loaded with action this is a thrill ride from beginning to end. I give it a B+. If you haven't read Greaney, but do love thrillers, climb on his fan train. He's a very good young writer who will be with us for decades to come so you will always be able to look forward to his next book. If you like Kyle Mills, Gregg Andrew Hurwitz, Brad Taylor or Mike Maden grab yourself a Greaney book for your next favorite author.

Fair Warning by Michael Connelly (2020) – Crime Thriller



Jack McEvoy, the journalist who never backs down, tracks a serial killer who has been operating completely under the radar--until now.

Veteran reporter Jack McEvoy has taken down killers before, but when a woman he had a one-night stand with is murdered in a particularly brutal way, McEvoy realizes he might be facing a criminal mind unlike any he's ever encountered. Jack investigates--against the warnings of the police and his own editor--and makes a shocking discovery that connects the crime to other mysterious deaths across the country. Undetected by law enforcement, a vicious killer has been hunting women, using genetic data to select and stalk his targets. Uncovering the murkiest corners of the dark web, Jack races to find and protect the last source who can lead him to his quarry. But the killer has already chosen his next target, and he's ready to strike. Terrifying and unputdownable, *Fair Warning* shows once again why "Michael Connelly has earned his place in the pantheon of great crime fiction writers"

I've mainly read Connelly's Bosch series (and binged on the series). My initial Jack McEvoy book was very good and I'll be reading the other two - [The Poet \(1996\)](#) and 2. [The Scarecrow \(2009\)](#). The thought processes the characters go through to piece together enough of the pieces of the case to catch the criminal is fascinating to me. I give Fair Warning an A. If you've not read Connelly (why not?) but like John Sandford, David Baldacci or Kathy Reichs, don't wait to read Connelly.





Mitch Albom – The Stranger in the Lifeboat – 23.99 – Religious Fiction





Barbara Taylor Bradford – A Man of Honor – 29.99 – General






Mark Cameron – Tom Clancy Chain of Command, A Jack Ryan Novel – 29.95 - Thriller

Michael Connelly – The Dark Hours, A Renee Ballard and Harry Bosch Novel – 29.00 – Mystery





There's chaos in Hollywood at the end of the New Year's Eve countdown. 



Jeffery Deaver – The Midnight Lock, A Lincoln Rhyme Novel – 28.00 – Thriller





Louise Erdrich – The Sentence – 28.99 – General



Louise Erdrich's latest novel, *The Sentence*, asks what we owe to the living, the dead, to the reader and to the book. A small independent bookstore in Minneapolis is haunted from November 2019 to November 2020 by the store's most annoying customer. Flora dies on All Souls' Day, but she simply won't leave the store. Tookie, who has landed a job selling books after years of incarceration that she survived by reading with murderous attention, must solve the mystery of this haunting while at the same time trying to understand all that occurs in Minneapolis during a year of grief, astonishment, isolation, and furious reckoning.

The Sentence begins on All Souls' Day 2019 and ends on All Souls' Day 2020. Its mystery and proliferating ghost stories during this one year propel a narrative as rich, emotional, and profound as anything Louise Erdrich has written.

Janet Evanovich – Game On, Tempting Twenty-Eight, A Stephanie Plum Novel – 28.99 – Thriller



Stephanie Plum returns to hunt down a new kind of criminal operating out of Trenton in the 28th book in the wildly popular series by #1 *New York Times* bestselling author Janet Evanovich.


When Stephanie Plum is woken up in the middle of the night by the sound of footsteps in her apartment, she wishes she didn't keep her gun in the cookie jar in her kitchen. And when she finds out the intruder is fellow apprehension agent Diesel, six feet of hard muscle and bad attitude who she hasn't seen in more than two years, she still thinks the gun might come in handy.

Turns out Diesel and Stephanie are on the trail of the same fugitive: Oswald Wednesday, an international computer hacker as brilliant as he is ruthless. Stephanie may not be the most technologically savvy sleuth, but she more than makes up for that with her dogged determination, her understanding of human nature, and her willingness to do just

about anything to bring a fugitive to justice. Unsure if Diesel is her partner or her competition in this case, she'll need to watch her back every step of the way as she sets the stage to draw Wednesday out from behind his computer and into the real world.

Christine Feehan – Dark Tarot, A Carpathian Novel – 28.00 – Romance

Ken Follett – Never – 36.00 – Thriller




Every catastrophe begins with a little problem that doesn't get fixed." So says Pauline Green, president of the United States, in Follett's nerve-racking drama of international tension.

A shrinking oasis in the Sahara Desert; a stolen US Army drone; an uninhabited Japanese island; and one country's secret stash of deadly chemical poisons: all these play roles in a relentlessly escalating crisis.

Struggling to prevent the outbreak of world war are a young woman intelligence officer; a spy working undercover with jihadists; a brilliant Chinese spymaster; and Pauline herself, beleaguered by a populist rival for the next president election.

Never is an extraordinary novel, full of heroines and villains, false prophets and elite warriors, jaded politicians and opportunistic revolutionaries. It brims with cautionary wisdom for our times, and delivers a visceral, heart-pounding read that transports readers to the brink of the unimaginable.

Diana Gabaldon – Go Tell the Bees That I am Gone, An Outlander Novel – 36.00 – Fantasy



Diana Gabaldon returns with the newest novel in the epic Outlander series.

The past may seem the safest place to be . . . but it is the most dangerous time to be alive. . . .

Jamie Fraser and Claire Randall were torn apart by the Jacobite Rising in 1746, and it took them twenty years to find each other again. Now the American Revolution threatens to do the same.

It is 1779 and Claire and Jamie are at last reunited with their daughter, Brianna, her husband, Roger, and their children on Fraser's Ridge. Having the family together is a dream the Frasers had thought impossible.



Nora Roberts – The Becoming, The Dragon Heart Legacy, Book 2 – 28.99 – Fantasy

The world of magick and the world of man have long been estranged from one another. But some can walk between the two--including Breen Siobhan Kelly. Danielle Steel – Flying Angels – 28.99 – General





Neal Stephenson – Termination Shock – 35.00 – Thriller




David Weber – In Fury Born – 16.00 – Sci Fi
