

A SYNOPSIS OF THE MEMOIR: MY WALK WITH GRIEF

My Walk With Grief is a spiritual memoir about my 10-year search for identity and love after living as a pastor's wife for 30 years, eventually marrying an agnostic.

This memoir is my story. When Mark died, part of me died too. For thirty years, I lived in his shadow as a pastor's wife. Unimpeded as a widow, I searched obsessively for identity and love. This journey pulled me into soul struggles, grief, world travel, disastrous dating, dog drama, spiritual surprises, and eventually, I married an agnostic who, to my surprise, embodied God's Grace.

The week my husband died exposed the internal conflict between my public role as a pastor's wife and my personal needs as a spouse. In the following ten years, I set out on a circuitous journey to rediscover myself, God, and new love as a middle-aged woman.

I wrote the memoir to uncover meaning for myself. I wrote it for others so I might no waste a good suffering. Although the book includes reflections on the week of Mark's death, it is mostly about the struggle to find me again the years that followed.


In my work as a psychotherapist, my brand was "some things in life are too hard to do alone." This statement is also true for the journey of grief. This writing uses my own story to reflect on the four steps I experienced in my own path toward a new life. These are 1) The Loss; 2) Survival; 3) Finding a new identity; and 4) Now what? I long for the stories of my journey to be helpful to others in theirs. Through this journey, I sought God and spiritual meaning.

I want the memoir to inspire people who know significant loss and encourage them to grieve deeply, to live fully, rediscover love, and the wideness of God's grace.



Turbulence, by John J. Nance, was published in 2002.




While the story is set in the days after Congress has provided financial support to airlines in the wake of the September 11 terrorist attacks, the story line could be pulled from today's headlines: Air Rage. The U.S. Government struggles to respond to what may be an opportunist manipulation of disgruntled passengers by terrorists, as the flight crew and passengers in route to South Africa are unaware that they are in the crosshairs. Miscommunications, misunderstandings, bad choices and worse behavior converge in a thriller that I found hard to put down. Nance's experience as a lieutenant colonel in the Air Force Reserve and creds as an aviation editor for Good Morning America result in a gut-punch of plausibility when things spiral out of control. Highly Recommended

Making Toast, by Roger Rosenblatt, is a memoir.



Rosenblatt and his wife move in with their son-in-law and small grandchildren when their 38-year-old daughter, Amy, dies of an asymptomatic heart condition. The book reads as a series of short essays that describe Amy's talents and personality, grandparents performing parental roles, spouse and siblings dealing with grief in their unique ways, and grandchildren coping with the fact that their mother is gone. From a brother keeping Amy's last voicemail on his phone just to hear her laugh, a "Word of the Day" each morning for the children to consider, the Boppo (grandson's name for Rosenblatt) National Anthem, and, of course, making toast, the memoir is a view into a private world of healing and growth after bereavement. 


Artifacts: A Faye Longchamp Mystery, Book 1 by Mary Anna Evans (2017)



Faye Longchamp has lost nearly everything except for her quick mind and a grim determination to hang onto her ancestral home, Joyeuse, a moldering plantation hidden along the Florida coast. No one knows how Faye's great-great-grandmother Cally, a newly freed slave barely out of her teens, came to own Joyeuse in the aftermath of the Civil War. No one knows how her descendants hung onto it through Reconstruction, world wars, the Depression, and Jim Crow, but Faye has inherited the island plantation-and the family tenacity. When the property taxes rise beyond her means, she sets out to save Joyeuse by digging for artifacts on her property and the surrounding National Wildlife Refuge and selling them on the black market. A tiny bit of that dead glory would pay a year's taxes. A big valuable chunk of the past would save her home forever. But instead of potsherds and arrowheads, she uncovers a woman's shattered skull, a Jackie Kennedy-style earring nestled against its bony cheek. Faye is torn. If she reports the forty-year-old murder, she'll reveal her illegal livelihood, thus risking jail and the loss of Joyeuse. She doesn't intend to let that happen,

so she probes into the dead woman's history, unaware that the past is rushing up on her like a hurricane across deceptively calm Gulf waters...

China Trade: The Lydia Chin/Bill Smith Series, Book 1 By: S. J. Rozan (1994)



Asian-American private investigator Lydia Chin knows New York City's Chinatown, its people, and its ways as no outsider ever could. So when the Chinatown Museum is robbed of a set of rare export porcelains, Lydia is hired to recover them quietly - a task that quickly proves more difficult than it at first appears. Maneuvering gently around the local gangs who control the streets of Chinatown, Lydia tackles an investigation that takes her - and her sometimes partner Bill Smith - far beyond the borders of Chinatown into the equally cryptic world of art and collecting, and upstart outer-borough gangs trying to gain a toe hold in the closed world of Chinatown.

The Metamorphosis by Franz Kafka (1915) - Classic



"When Gregor Samsa woke up one morning from unsettling dreams, he found himself changed in his bed into a monstrous vermin."

With this startling, bizarre, yet surprisingly funny first sentence, Kafka begins his masterpiece, *The Metamorphosis*. It is the story of a young man who, transformed overnight into a giant beetlelike insect, becomes an object of disgrace to his family, an outsider in his own home, a quintessentially alienated man. A harrowing--though absurdly comic--meditation on human feelings of inadequacy, guilt, and isolation, *The Metamorphosis* has taken its place as one of the most widely read and influential works of twentieth-century fiction.

See How They Run by James Patterson (1979) – Thriller



Outside New York City, the palatial home of Dr. David Strauss's parents is attacked by gunmen during a glittering party. As he watches helplessly, his wife is murdered. In Los Angeles, Strauss's brother is killed during the Academy Award ceremonies. In Manhattan, his past sweetheart, Alix Rothchild, is running for her life.

Dr. David Strauss is soon obsessed with finding the explosive secret behind the murders of his family members. His dangerous odyssey takes him across Europe, and finally to the Olympics, where one of the most shattering surprises in suspense fiction will take place.

An early Patterson, originally entitled The Jericho Commandment, is staged 7-years after the Black September Palestinian terrorist massacre of Israeli athletes at the 1972 Munich Olympics. Patterson weaves a plausible retaliatory action. While online reviews treat the book harshly, I enjoyed it. I Give it a B. It was a quick read and had plenty of action to keep me fully engaged.

Nora Roberts – Awakening, The Dragon Heart Legacy Book 1 – 17.99 – Fantasy




Nora Roberts begins a new trilogy of adventure, romance, and magick in The Awakening.







It is one of the early works of science fiction, long recognized as an influential work that has not previously been available in English.
